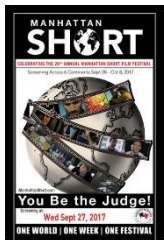
An arthritic Nova Scotia woman works as a housekeeper while she hones her skills as an artist and eventually becomes a beloved figure in the community.

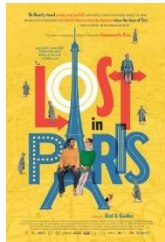

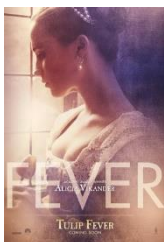

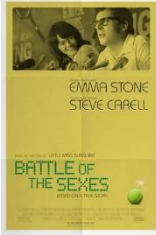
The life of celebrated but reclusive author, J.D. Salinger, who gained worldwide fame with the publication of his novel, *The Catcher in the Rye*.
